

Perhaps a similar gantry could be erected at each end of the bridge to present a height barrier which would stop most of the heavy vehicles. Here is some idea of what it might look like:



Perhaps the horizontal bars could have the words “Wansford Bridge” on them, with a plaque giving some details about our ancient bridge which was a key feature of the main North-South route in England. [Curiously, all the bridge is in the Wansford Parish, the far

side being Sibson-cum-Stibbington.] It might be, of course, that just one barrier would suffice.

Many other bridge users complain about the refusal of some drivers to give way to traffic already on the bridge. Certainly traffic lights would solve the problem, although with such a long bridge the delay time would be long.
