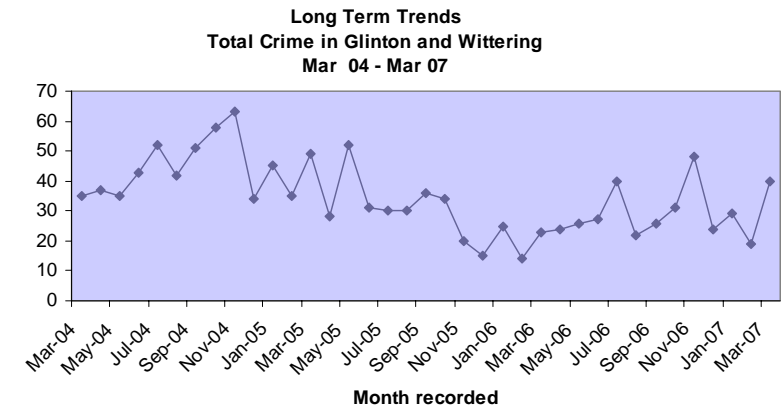


GLINTON AND WITTERING : MONTHLY CRIME AND DISORDER PROFILE MARCH 2007

What has been happening this month in Community Safety?

Cambridgeshire Constabulary

Cambridgeshire constabulary have noticed that with the improved weather recently more householders are leaving windows open on their properties. Residents are reminded that it presents an opportunity for criminals to access houses and the property inside. A large percentage of burglaries are carried out accessing a property through an insecure window or door. Police in Peterborough are reminding residents to be vigilant against this and to ensure that when leaving a property all windows and doors are shut and locked. When police officers speak to victims of burglaries they often see the shock people feel when someone has entered their home through an open window whilst the homeowners are somewhere else in the house

Crime updates are now available online for victims. You can now check the progress of your case. Only crimes reported since 1st November 2006 are available. The site only displays certain types of crimes and not those of a sensitive nature. When logged onto the Cambridgeshire Force website victims can click on 'Crime advice' which will provide a drop down option to choose 'Online victim of crime updates'. Additional information can also be sent to the officer in charge via a secure form.

Police in Peterborough are warning against current scams circulating at the moment:

A company claiming to be phoning on behalf of Crimestoppers and the Fire service are offering to come to homes and perform a safety check. Do not take the company up on this offer. The Fire and Rescue Service in Peterborough offer a free safety check- please phone 0800 328 9208.

There is also a company telephoning homeowners to inform them that they are booking them in for a home survey and giving them a free intruder alarm system- which costs £295 for them to install. The homeowner is given little choice in the matter and the company uses very hard sales techniques.

There is an email circulating from a man posing as a senior partner in a 'private investigators and security consultants' firm. He alleges that he is part of an investigation involving a client who shares the same surname with you and circumstances surrounding investments made by this client at 'HSBC'. He claims that as you share similar details he is prepared to place you in a position to instruct the firm to release the deposit to you if you share the proceeds with him 50/50. Peterborough police advise people to be aware of this email scam.

e-cops is an innovative e-mail newsletter scheme from Cambridgeshire Constabulary which keeps you informed of local crime information, community news and policing activities in your neighbourhood.
