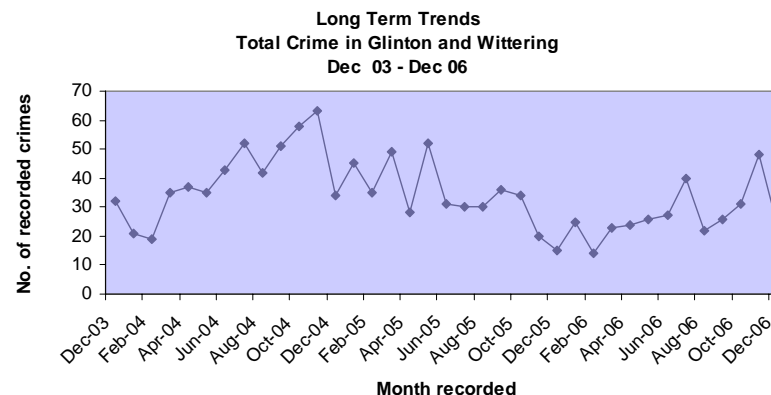


# GLINTON AND WITTERING : MONTHLY CRIME AND DISORDER PROFILE DECEMBER 2006
