3. Review of Planning Application – 06/00987/OUT 14 Robins Field, Wansford: <p>The Chairman confirmed that this meeting had been called by Fred Aspin and Paul Rudd, two Parish Council members, to reconsider the response submitted to the planning application for 14 Robins Field. He outlined the format of the meeting and set out procedures. He further stated that at the previous meeting, during which this application was discussed, the withdrawal of members from the meeting to comply with the Code of Conduct could have led to errors being made inadvertently, as it was over a period of years the PC gained experience in transparency and constructive discussion. The modifications to the current WPC Standing Orders were to bring them in line with National Guidelines; and reflected instances where planning applications had highlighted requirements for change. At present, WPC Standing Orders did not incorporate the rescission of any previous decision made by the Parish Council; but this will be considered at the next meeting. This meeting was to decide whether another response would be submitted to Peterborough City Council.</p> <p>The Clerk advised that a clear decision must be reached at this meeting, and agreed by majority vote. She distributed a list of residents who, after due consideration, had signed the letter of objection to the Parish Council, dated the 31st July, in response to the PCs letter of 17th July to the Planning Officer in respect of this application.</p> <p>Fred Aspin requested that the Clerk was delegated to continue to take Minutes, from the public area, and conditionally on taking no part in the discussion. This was agreed.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">(Richard Clarke left the room and Alan Jones assumed the Chair)</p> <p>The Chairman believed that each application was considered on its own merit and described the stages that resulted in a response being submitted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Responses from residents were given due consideration at the Parish Council Meeting of the 3rd July. • A sub-committee was agreed at that meeting and delegated to submit a response to meet the deadline. • The sub-committee undertook a full review of the application and then a detailed site visit after which, a draft response for consideration was circulated among the sub-committee and, on affirmation, the response was submitted. <p>The Chairman requested Fred Aspin and Paul Rudd to confirm their reasons for calling this meeting.</p> <p>Paul Rudd stated his principle reason was because the first letter submitted by the Parish Council to Peterborough City Council (PCC), was in clear objection to the erection of two dwellings on the site. Having been absent from the subsequent meeting, which considered the second and similar application, he was shocked to learn of the Parish Council's response and very disappointed that wider consultation had not been secured.</p> <p>Fred Aspin stated that, as a newly elected member, he believed that this meeting</p>
